1. People often record the words of the dying because death makes people think about what is most important. What was the last word of Adoniram Judson (A.J.) Gordon?
2. Do you remember what God promised to Jacob, Isaac, and Abraham? Peek at Genesis 28:12-16 for a hint!
3. Jacob blesses Joseph and his two sons (Genesis 48:15-16). What did you find interesting in this blessing?
4. In Genesis 48: 17-20, Jacob places his right hand on the younger son's head and his left hand on the older son's head. Both boys will be great, but the younger son will be greater than the older son. Can you remember an earlier story in Genesis where the younger brother is set above the older for a blessing?

5. True or False. Jacob dies in Egypt, but he is confident the future of his descendants is in Canaan. Because of this he asks to be buried in Egypt in a pyramid.
6. Jacob had faith. According to Hebrews 11:1, “Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we _____.”
7. True or False. We can’t see all the stars with our naked eye, but they are still there. Likewise, we can’t fully see all of God’s promises, but they are still there and someday we will see every one of God’s promises fulfilled!
8. No matter what mess rages here on this planet, no matter what global, national or personal situation is causing us anxiety, God is in control. We may not see the big picture, but we love and trust our God who does. Write down one thing that causes worry and anxiety in your life. Then write, “God is in control.”



9. Do you remember what God promised to Jacob, his father, Isaac, and his grandpa, Abraham? Peek at Genesis 28:12-16 for a hint!
10. True or False. Jacob’s life ended with a happily ever after because he trusted in God’s promises that he couldn’t fully see.
11. We may not see the big picture, but we love and trust our God who does. Happily ever after comes from relying on God’s promises and “fixing our eyes on _____, the pioneer and perfecter of faith” (Hebrews 12:3).
12. Read Jacob’s blessing to his son, Judah, in Genesis 49:10. To hold a scepter and a ruler’s staff means that one of Judah’s descendants will rule. Did you know that King David was from the tribe of Judah? Can you guess who was the best KING ever to come from the royal line of Judah? Peek at Matthew 1 for a hint!
