Talk about Genesis 6-9.¹

1. Why would God destroy the people he created?
2. Why did God save Noah?
3. How is sin today similar to the sin in Noah's day?
4. How was Noah different than all the people who lived around him?
5. What did God promise Noah if he obeyed him?

Did you know...

“The earth isn’t the only planet in our solar system with a moon. Saturn has one too. Well, actually it has 53 moons! One of them is called Titan. This faraway moon has something else you might have thought only the Earth had - rainbows. Here on Earth, rainbows happen when light from the Sun bounces in and out of water droplets in the air, especially after a rain shower. Titan’s moon is wet, but not with water. Its moisture contains methane - a gas that is poisonous to humans. So Titan’s rainbows form when the light bounces in and out of the droplets of methane...So why is a rainbow on a faraway moon called Titan important? Because it tells you something about God: His promises are universal! No matter what’s happening, how old you are, or where you are - even on a moon called Titan - God keeps his promises. Every single one. Pretty awesome, huh?”

7. How did God keep his promise to Noah?
8. Can you remember a word we used to describe someone who believes God for things he/she can’t see? (Hint: Hebrews 11:7). What did Noah believe that he couldn’t see?
9. What would you do with a boat full of animals while you waited for the rain to stop and the flood to go away?
10. When we say God is faithful, we mean he keeps his promises. How was God faithful to Noah?
11. After Noah got off the ark, what did Noah do that pleased God? (Hint: Genesis 8:20-22).
12. Do you remember why God gave us rainbows?

Prayer: Father God, thank you for rainbows which remind me that you keep your promises, and thank you for JESUS, who saves me from my sin. Amen.

Memory Verse: “She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.” Matthew 1:21
