Did you know...

"The earth isn't the only planet in our solar system with a moon. Saturn has one too. Well, actually it has 53 moons! One of them is called Titan. This faraway moon has something else you might have thought only the Earth had - rainbows. Here on Earth, rainbows happen when light from the Sun bounces in and out of water droplets in the air, especially after a rain shower. Titan's moon is wet, but not with water. Its moisture contains methane - a gas that is poisonous to humans. So Titan's rainbows form when the light bounces in and out of the droplets of methane...So why is a rainbow on a faraway moon called Titan important? Because it tells you something about God: His promises are universal! No matter what's happening, how old you are, or where you are - even on a moon called Titan - God keeps his promises. Every single one. Pretty awesome, huh?"
