PHRASE	MOTION
ISAIAH 9:6	
"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given;	Have the children pretend to cradle a baby in their arms and rock it back and forth.
"and the government shall be upon his shoulder,	Have the children touch their fingers to their shoulders.
"and his name shall be called	Have the children cup their hands around their mouths like a megaphone.
"Wonderful Counselor,	Have the children raise their hands above their heads and spread their fingers as they quickly move their arms to their side.
"Mighty God,	Have the children make a muscle with their right arm.
"Everlasting Father,	Have the children wave their right hand in a circle above their head and then do the same with their left.
"Prince of Peace."	Have the children form a crown with their two hands, fingers spread and rest it on their heads.

- 1. Who told the shepherds what was going on?
- 2. Do you remember what the angel said?
- 3. What did the shepherds do after the angels left?
- 4. Imagine that you were a shepherd back in the time when Jesus was born. What do you think it would be like to see angels appear in the sky? Would you be afraid? Excited?
- 5. Why do you think the shepherds were afraid?
- 6. What was the good news the angels brought the shepherds?
- 7. Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promise planned from time eternal to save us from our sins. How did Jesus do that?
