

Psalm 74

- Of David. A psalm.
- 1 The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it;
- 2 for he founded it on the seas and established it on the waters.
- 3 Who may ascend the mountain of the Lord? Who may stand in his holy place?
- 4 The one who has clean hands and a pure heart, who does not trust in an idol or swear by a false god.
- 5 They will receive blessing from the Lord and vindication from God their Savior.
- 6 Such is the generation of those who seek him, who seek your face, God of Jacob.

- 7 Lift up your heads, you gates; be lifted up, you ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in.
- 8 Who is this King of glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord mighty in battle.
- 9 Lift up your heads, you gates; lift them up, you ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in.
- 10 Who is he, this King of glory?
 The Lord Almighty—
 he is the King of glory.
- 1. God loves a parade! In 2 Samuel 6 there was a famous parade to bring a special item back to Jerusalem. What was this item?
- 2. Psalm 24 is called an enthronement Psalm because it proclaims God as ___ __ ___ ___
- 3. In Psalm 22 we celebrate our suffering Savior. In Psalm 23 we worship our Shepherd Savior. And in Psalm 24 we bow before our Mighty King Savior. Draw a symbol to remember each of these three Psalms: cross, shepherd's staff, and a crown.

4.	Psalm 24 has three stanzas. In verses 1-2 God is praised as <u>C</u> and Sustainer. In verses 3-6 God is received as <u>S</u> In verses 7-10 God is
	joyfully welcomed as the One True <u>K</u>
5.	Psalm 24 asks the same question twice. What is the question? (Hint: see verses 8 & 10). Why do you think this question is important?
6.	True or False. During the last week before the crucifixion, as Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey with crowds waving palm branches and laying down cloaks, Psalm 24 was being recited by the temple priests. The crowds shouted, ""Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" And the priests recited, "Who is he, this King of glory?"
7.	True or False. When we connect the dots between Genesis 49:11, Psalm 24, and Zechariah 9: we see that Jesus riding in on an elephant "fulfilled what was spoken through the prophets" (Matthew 21:4).
8.	The disciples put their cloaks on the donkey and then <i>placed</i> Jesus on the donkey. The language is clear, they <i>put</i> Jesus on this donkey. They were enthroning Jesus as the of of (Hint: Psalm 24:10)
9.	True or False. The people wanted a Warrior King to free them from Roman oppression, but Jesus came as the Savior King to establish a Kingdom with no end through his death on a cross and resurrection from the dead.
10.	In order to complete His mission Jesus faced the most difficult week of his life. Can you list any of the events Jesus experienced in his last week leading up to the cross?
11.	"If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9). According to this verse, what does it take to enthrone Jesus as the King of Glory in our lives?
12.	Jesus died on the cross for sinners. He triumphed over death through the empty tomb. And now he reigns in glory at the right hand of God the Father as the King of heaven and earth. How would you answer the most important question ever asked of you: "Who is the King of Glory?"
