Prelude: 'What Child Is This', 'Coventry Carol' (16th Century English Carol), Corelli 'Fatto per la Notte di Natale', movements 1-5 (Christmas Concerto).

****Music of Preparation:** 'Pastorale', movement 6 from Corelli's 'Christmas Concerto'. In seventeenth-century Italy the pastorale became associated with Christmastime as a representation of the shepherds who attended Jesus' birth. Baroque composers imitated shepherd music with simple melodic upper parts, often in parallel thirds and sixths, over a drone similar to that of bagpipes. Corelli appears to have been the first to include a pastorale in a concerto and to have such a piece performed in church on Christmas Eve.
