GIVING PRAISE TO GOD

*Call to Worship Psalm 25

Why do we do what we do? The call to worship is a reminder from God's Word that coming together isn't our initiative. We didn't think this up. God is the One who has called us into His presence for His glory and our good, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Leader: In you LORD I put my trust.

People: Show me your ways, LORD, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long.

Leader: Remember, LORD, your great mercy and love.

People: Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in his ways. He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them his way. All the ways of the LORD are loving and faithful towards those who keep the demands of his covenant.

Leader: Who, then, are those who fear the LORD?

All: He will instruct them in the ways they should choose. They will spend their days in prosperity, and their descendants will inherit the land. The LORD confides in those who fear him; he makes his covenant known to them. My eyes are on the LORD, for only he will release my feet from the snare. May integrity and uprightness protect me, because my hope, LORD, is in you.
