## **Acts 1:8 Connection: Outreach Ministries**

El Montecito Presbyterian Church supports numerous ministries and organizations near and far, including Dana and Karen Ostby. Pray for their ministry in Central Asia. Over the past year, rules there have tightened, and social projects soon may not be allowed to receive external donations from foundations as in the past. In response, many foundations have cut all funding, including major US donors. Social projects are discussing how to stay within the rules while continuing to carry out their services. One viable recommendation is to start a business that generates income from within the country. The other is to cut staff and rely on volunteers and private donations. We are open to ideas and investments in them.

- The first project in Central Asia we invested in was the NGY Youth Center. Since 2003, this ministry has been reaching out to underprivileged kids in and around the capital city through after-school clubs, summer day camps, and mountain trekking. They operate on a shoestring budget with minimal staff, but with many local volunteers, student interns, and local donations.
- The second project is Hands of Hope Women's Project. They previously had major US sponsors who all cut funding suddenly in January 2025.
- The final project is Camp Adonai, which has served thousands of children and youth since 2001, when I returned to Central Asia after Joe's passing. As I write, the staff are holding a youth camp on the theme "Stop and Learn" Focused on the Holy Spirit and our Identity in Christ.
