**Sermon** "He Has Made Me Glad"

#### Sermon notes:

"Though you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy, for you are receiving the end result of your faith, the salvation of your souls." 1 Peter 1:3-9 NIV

"Gratitude and joy are the twin children of grace, organically joined, theologically and spiritually. In the Greek language, they are even related linguistically. Grace, gratitude and joy all have the same root, *char*, a noun that refers to health and well-being. Grace is *charis*, gratitude is *eucharistia*, and joy is *chara*."

What is merely pictured in Greek, is a burning reality in the Kingdom of God. Grace is God's mercy, his unmerited favor. It is what Frederick Buechner calls the "crucial eccentricity" of the Christian faith, the unique and odd thing God does when he forgives sinners – giving them not the bad things they deserve, but the incredibly good things they don't deserve. What else can one be but grateful when this happens? "How can anything more or different be asked of man?" writes Karl Barth. "The only answer to charis is eucharistia.... Grace and gratitude belong together like heaven and earth. Grace evokes gratitude like the voice of an echo. Gratitude follows grace like thunder and lightning."
